

# Exaggeration

**Definition of Exaggeration**  
to portray something as greater than it actually is;  
to overstate.

When an author exaggerates, he usually starts with factual information. Then he adds something absurdly overstated to make the characters and situations attention grabbing and humorous.

An example of exaggeration from *The Fabled Fourth Graders of Aesop Elementary School* is:

**Factual Statement:**

Aesop Elementary School had many items in its lost and found box.

**Exaggeration:**

“The place looked magical—almost like Aladdin’s cave. Instead of heaps of gold and mountains of jewels, however, there were heaps of snow boots and mountains of bean bag animals.”



An example of exaggeration from *Sideways Stories from Wayside School* is:

**Factual Statement**

Dana, a student at Wayside School, had beautiful eyes.

**Exaggeration:**

“And if she had a hundred eyes, all over her face and her arms and her feet, why, she would have been the most beautiful creature in the world.”
