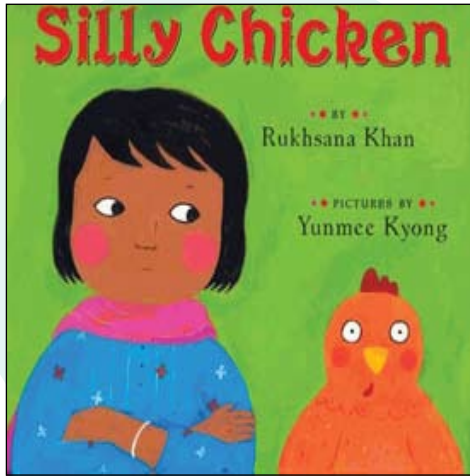

- *Fritz's Fish* by Geraldine Elschner. Penguin, 2005. ISBN: 0698400283. Fritz, who longs to have a pet, captures a fish after the river floods his neighborhood, but must decide how long he can keep him in the apartment bathtub.
- *Just Dog* by Hiawyn Oram. Chronicle Books 1998. ISBN: 0811822478. Dog is a dog, and that's what everyone calls him: Dog. But Dog is sure he deserves a more exciting name, and he sets out to prove it, much to the amusement of a cat named Midnight.

Hannah revels in dirty clothes and jumbled heaps while Hilary has a place for everything. But when a furry, fun-loving creature grows from the depths of Hannah's mess, a jealous Hilary steals some of her sister's gooey gobs to create a fabulous "mess pet" of her own.

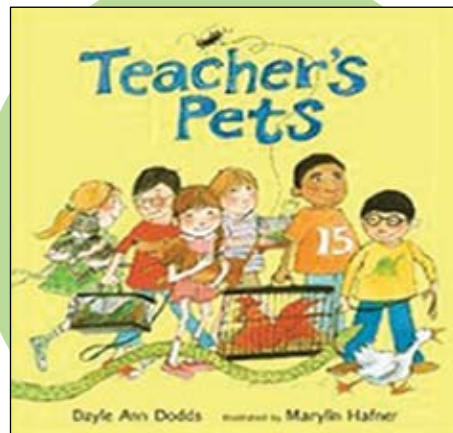
